

A donation basket will be on the table if you wish to donate toward the meal. Please RSVP by Thursday, April 8 if you plan to attend. After our dinner, we will have a baked good auction. Cakes, cookies, desserts of all kinds will be auctioned off to raise money for our Annie Armstrong Easter offering. Our auctioneer will be our very own host of the "country bunker."
